# **SECTION 3: HAZARDS IDENTIFICATION**

### 3.1 EMERGENCY OVERVIEW

### 3.3 POTENTIAL ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS

This substance did not degrade significantly in a ready biodegradation test. Testing indicates this product has minimal toxicity to aquatic organisms (100 mg/L < Lowest LC50, EC50, or IC50 < or = 1000 mg/L). Testing indicates this product has insignificant toxicity to wastewater treatment system organisms (sludge respiration IC50 > 1000 mg/L).

# **SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES**
